**Aims of the JA**

The Journal of Anthrozoology will publish

- Original research articles (up to 6000 words excluding tables, figures and references)
- Review articles (up to 8000 words)
- Short communications (up to 5000 words)
- Book reviews and lists of new books, and
- News about conferences, course announcements, etc.

in the multidisciplinary field of anthrozoology. The aims of the journal are: to promote the field of anthrozoology in Asia, and in particular, in Japan, by providing a publication venue tailored to the interests, culture, and language abilities of researchers and practitioners in this part of the world, while still meeting international peer-review standards; to provide a publication venue with a relatively short turn-around time between submission and appearance and assistance in improving the English manuscript, rather than simply returning it to the corresponding author for reworking because of language problems and before the review process. The language of the journal is English, but original research, review, and short articles will have both English. It is foreseen that four issues per year, later - as the JA becomes better established, six issues - will be published.

### **Guidelines for Submission**

All materials for all above-mentioned categories are to be submitted **electronically** (via e-mail) *in English* abstract to

who will select, together with the Associate Editor(s), at least two reviewers for the manuscript.

for details and follow them carefully when preparing the manuscript!

The JA will **not** publish original research of questionable ethical merit and requires that the corresponding author sends a **signed letter** (at the same time that the manuscript is submitted electronically) listing the title of the manuscript and stating „This research was approved by the ethics committee of the institution under whose name the research was conducted and is conform with national ethics-, data protection- and animal welfare- laws and regulations.“ Additionally and **on the same page**, the corresponding author must confirm that this manuscript is not currently being considered for publication elsewhere, and that it will not be submitted elsewhere, until notification of the decision by the JA whether or not to publish is received.
